All the kerosene/diesel containers were empty, refilled 5 cans. Should not need any more for this winter.

League Secretary report –

Bullseye league schedule is the same, Benchrest matches will continue on the 3rd Saturday of the month. There will not be a State sponsored EIC match this year, we are trying to sponsor a special match on The 28th of June instead. This will be the same as the match we sponsored last year.

Brad Sodder gave an overview of the Rimfire Match new rules as follows:

LPRC.22 RIMFIRE RIFLE LEAGUE 2025

This match is not sanctioned by any group, just internal to the club.

One scored league "season" is scheduled for 2025. We will be starting in March and plan to wrap up around mid-June. If you want to get started on the league a little early, that's perfectly fine, the goal is to promote people to get out and shoot at the range. Match fee will be \$5.00.

This year we will be doing things a little different. The competition will be combining two different courses of fire to determine the overall winner and plaque winners. The first course of fire will be benchrest, similar to past years. The second course of fire will be shooting our rifles along with the pistol shooters on their Thursday night shoots (or at other times if needed).

For the benchrest portion we will be using IBS Rimfire 50 yard, targets. Any .22 caliber rimfire rifle is fine, even target rifles provided that they do not utilize any type of barrel tuner. Rifle scopes with no more than 18 power may be used. You may use a basic type front rest and a separate rear sand bag type rest. No one piece front and rear rests or clamp style rests for the rifle. There are 25 scoring rings with the possibility of 10 points for

each ring for a total possible score of 250 per target, with 4 targets required for the league, 1000 points total possible.

For the standing position in the pistol house, we will be following the Precision Pistol (Bullseye) course of fire. The target used at both distances will be the NRA 100 Yard smallbore rifle target (TQ-4). Course of fire is 10 rounds slow fire at 50 yards. Then at 25 yards, 10 rounds timed fire (5 rounds in 20 seconds X 2), and 10 rounds rapid fire (5 rounds in 10 seconds X 2). The total possible score is 300 per round of shooting, with 4 rounds required for the league, 1200 points total possible. You will need another shooter to score your target, and score and paste as you move stages. A semi-automatic rifle is needed for the timed and rapid portion of the shooting. Any combination of rifles may be used.

All benchrest targets and standing position scorecards should be placed in the rifle house, on the clip, for collection. Awards will be given to the top four shooters. You may contact Brad Soddors at 614-395-1359 or soddorsbj@yahoo.com for more info.
